

OPEN CLASS RULES AND REGULATIONS

GENERAL

1. The Trego County Free Fair reserves to the Trego County Fair Board, the final and absolute right to interpret these rules and regulations, and arbitrate, settle and determine all matters, questions and differences in regard to or otherwise arising out of connected with, or incident to the Fair.
2. The Trego County Fair Board reserves the right to amend and add to these rules, as they in their judgment may deem advisable. In the event of conflict for general or specific rules, the Trego County Fair Board will govern.
3. Any person who violates any of the following or special rules will forfeit all privileges and premiums and be subject to such penalties as the Trego County Fair Board may order.
4. The following rules and regulations will apply to each and every department of the Fair, and exhibitors. Concessionaires are requested to familiarize themselves with all rules.
5. All entries must be filed at the appropriate place no later than the date and time specified. The Trego County Fair Board reserves the right to reject any entries offered.
6. All Open Class, 4-H, FFA, and Scouts Exhibits will be released on Monday at 12 Noon. Failure to comply with this requirement will bar said exhibitors from participating in premiums, which may have been awarded by the judge in any department of the Fair. No mailed entries will be returned from the Fair Office, unless sufficient postage is sent for return mailing. All articles not called for 5 days after the closing day of the Fair, will become the property of the Fair Association, unless other arrangements were made with the Trego County Fair Board.
7. No entry fee will be charged on any animal or article entered for exhibition and no money will be taken from premium winners. All entry blanks must remain in the Trego County Fair Office and a claim check will be issued for the article listed.
8. All property of a character entered for competition, display, or for other purposes or being anywhere on the Fair Grounds, shall be subject to the control of the Trego County Fair Board.
9. In no case shall the Trego County Free Fair or the Trego County Fair Board be held responsible for any loss, damage, accident, injury, or death from any cause of people, animals, cars, machinery, or disease of any character while they or their property are on the Fair Grounds, at any time or place.
10. If the property owner(s) or others interested in the property desire protection against loss, damage from injury, fire, or from other causes; they must make their own arrangements and pay for such insurance.
11. Exhibitors will be required to keep their places and stalls in a clean condition by removing any filth and litter from in front and behind said pens and stalls and; lace them convenient for the litter force of the Trego County Fair Board to gather up.
ALL TRASH MUST BE BAGGED.
12. If it is ascertained that an exhibitor has made or caused to be made any false statement in regard to any animal or article, or if any exhibitor attempts to interfere with the judges in the performance of their duties, the exhibitor shall be excluded from competition or exhibition on the Fair Grounds of the association.
13. The Superintendent shall exclude livestock from competing should there be any unnecessary or embarrassing delay on the part of the exhibitor in bringing the animals into the show rings.
14. Exhibitors shall show their animals at such times and places as may be directed and shall furnish such information concerning their stock as may be required by the Superintendent and the refusal to do so will result in the forfeiting of any and all claims for awards.
15. Persons exhibiting livestock will bear all expenses of vaccination where required by state regulation. All animals are subject to examination by the exhibition staff or their representatives, and

- shall be free of clinical signs of infection or contagious disease.
16. Special care will be taken that no animals having a communicable disease of any nature enters the Fair Grounds at any time during the Fair. The Superintendent will refuse unloading privilege to any stock having diseases.
 17. Nothing shall be sold or given away or otherwise disposed of by exhibitors which may in any way conflict with or which is subject matter of any privileges or concessions granted or sold by the Trego County Free Fair.
 18. Any items having previously won premium monies at the Trego County Fair will not be eligible to compete again.

CLAIMS FOR INJURY

1. No claims for injury to any persons or property shall be asserted or suit instituted or maintained against the Trego County Free Fair, its Board or their agents by or on behalf of any person, firm or corporation or their agents representatives, servant or employees having license or privileges to exhibit on Fair Grounds or occupy and space thereon.
2. If any damage, loss, injury or property shall be approximately caused by reason of neglect or willful act of any person, firm, corporation, their agents or representatives, servant, or employees having license privilege to exhibit on said Fair Grounds or occupy space thereon, the Trego County Free Fair and the Trego County Fair Board shall not in any manner be responsible therefore and in case it be subject to any expense or liability all persons causing same are liable therefore and shall indemnify the Trego County Free Fair at WaKeeney, Kansas.

REMOVAL OF EXHIBITS & DISPLAYS

1. The Trego County Fair Board reserves the right to remove from the ground any exhibit, animals, concession, or show that may be falsely entered or may have any sign, banner or advertising matter of any kind which may be deemed unsuitable or objectionable by them without assigning a reason therefore and at their discretion return and money already paid for space for stalls which shall exonerate them from any claim whatsoever on the part of the exhibitor or purchaser.

CONCESSIONS AND PRIVILEGES

1. The Trego County Fair Board authorizes the letting of only such privileges or concessions as are necessary to supply the wants of the people or as may add to their comfort, convenience or pleasure, but under no circumstances will a privilege of a questionable nature or of a demoralizing tendency be let, or in any manner tolerated where the business is conducted in any other than a legitimate and trade-like manner. The sale of alcoholic liquors and games of chance are strictly prohibited.
2. Parties desiring to purchase privileges can do so at any time on application to the Trego County Fair Board at the Fair Grounds on or before the first day of the Fair.
3. Concession space can be contracted prior to opening of Fair. No spot will be reserved after noon second day of Fair and any money put up for the spot not occupied by that time will be declared forfeited.
4. All space allotted must be improved and decorated by the purchaser at his own expense.
5. All light and power used shall be paid for by concessionaires and commercial exhibitors. The Trego County Fair Board reserves the right to place a meter on any and all lines where its judgment is to their advantage to do so and where the current consumed totals more than the minimum. Each concessionaire and commercial exhibitor must pay for installing his own light.
6. Each concession must confine him or herself to the space consigned. Failure to do so will subject him or her to failure of their privilege.
7. The Trego County Fair Board will use every precaution to guard against extortion of any form practiced upon patrons of the Fair. A violation of this rule by any concessionaire will cause the forfeiture of contract and money paid, or expulsion from the grounds, or both, as the Trego County Fair Board may direct.
8. Access to concession – Any Trego County Fair Board Member or any official representative of the Trego County Free Fair shall have access

to the premises of any exhibitor or concessionaire at any and all time.
9. Care of concessions – All the buildings and ground space is to be kept neat and clean. The concessionaire is to deposit all refuse and rubbish in the receptacles provided by the Trego County Free Fair and is to conduct his or her business in an orderly manner.

ALL TRASH MUST BE BAGGED.

10. The Building and Stands – All booths, tents or other enclosures erected must meet with the approval of the Trego County Fair Board.
11. Price Signs – A sign shall be posted at the front or entrance of each stand or enclosure, showing the prices charged for lunches, the management, and to be at all time in view of the customers.
12. Advertising – The tacking, posting or placing advertising outside of the space contracted for will not be permitted; neither will soliciting be allowed outside the booth or enclosure or any privilege.

ADVERTISING

1. The distribution of handbills, fliers and heralds will not under any circumstances be permitted except as granted by the Trego County Fair Board or Other Fair Associations. Anyone violating this rule is liable to fine or expulsion from the grounds.
2. Begging, soliciting, and public speaking are positively prohibited.

PREMIUMS AND AWARDS

1. Awards will be made by single judge system. The decision of the judges shall be final and no appeal will be considered, except in the case of a written protest presented to the Dept. Superintendent within 12 hours.
2. The judges in all departments will be appointed by the Trego County Fair Board.
3. All premiums awarded under the rules and regulations of this premium list will be paid in full, according to the rules, but in no case shall a premium be awarded on any article unworthy of same. No entrance fee will be charged and no money will be deducted from the premium winners.
4. No premium will be awarded by the Trego County Fair Board except as definitely stated in the premium list.
5. When there is no competition or when the exhibit is not worthy of first or second prize, the judge shall place it in the class to which it belongs as judged by the standard or such articles. The judge shall decide as to what standard.
6. Premium checks can be mailed to you instead of being picked up in person at The Fair Office. You must provide a self-addressed stamped envelope.

ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES

Conduct rules on Fair Grounds in accordance with the regulations adopted by the Board of County Commissioners. Consumption of Alcoholic Beverages, Cereal Malt Beverages and Controlled Substances are Prohibited. No alcoholic liquor, cereal malt beverages, or controlled substances (hereinafter referred to collectively as “prohibited substances”) as such terms are defined in the Kansas States Annotated, may be consumed, possessed, or distributed on the Fair Ground premises, except in designated areas. Violating exhibitors will have all entries disqualified. Violator of this prohibition shall be subject to penalties.

- Check in at the Fair Office for entry number and entry card; then bring everything to the Exhibit Building.
- All entries will be displayed in the Exhibit Building.

- Premiums are as follows: Blue - \$5.00; Red - \$4.00; White - \$3.00
- Attach to the back of the picture: Name, Age, Gender & Class.

DEPARTMENT A – Poultry & Rabbits

Animals will be checked for lice and mites – if found, will NOT be able to enter fair.

- A. A maximum of one Blue, one Red, and one White will be awarded in each class. But, in no event shall a premium be awarded on any animal not worthy of a 1st, 2nd, or White.
- B. Singles cannot compete with pens, and specimens entered in pens cannot compete with singles, nor can old singles or pens compete with young singles or pens.
- C. The different varieties of each breed must compete with each other.
- D. Each exhibitor must indicate on the entry tag which class the fowl are exhibited in (whether old or young, single or pens) and the name of the variety.
- E. None but purebred fowl will be awarded premium.
- F. No exhibitor is to show more than two breeds of poultry.
- G. An exhibitor can't make more than 1 entry in any class.
- H. A competent poultry judge will be present to judge the fowl by the comparison method according to the rules of the American Poultry Assn.
- I. Fowl on display are not to be handled by anyone, either exhibitor or visitor, except by officers of the poultry department or by their consent.

- D. Exhibitors may replace with fresh fruit any specimens that show a tendency to spot or decay at any time during the Fair, except when the judge is working upon the class to which it belongs.

- F. Items must be grown by exhibitor.
- G. Decayed, injured or inferior specimens must not be exhibited -- When such specimens appear in a collection, not only will they not be counted, but they will be considered by the judge as lowering the comparative standard of the exhibit.
- H. Taste in arrangement and neatness in keeping of the exhibit will also be considered by the judge in making awards.
- I. In order to conform to the Pure Food Law, now in effect, No exhibit will be allowed to be displayed in poisonous fluids.
